May 28, 29 and 30th 2024 Language and Artificial Intelligence. Linguistic Approaches and interdisciplinary Challenges

Second call for papers

The Department of Written and Oral Expression of the Faculty of Liberal Arts at the Adolfo Ibáñez University invites academics, researchers, communication professionals, and postgraduate students interested in language studies, language teaching and digital humanities to participate in the V International PRISMA Conference, to be held, in-person or through a hybrid modality, on May 28, 29, and 30, 2024, in Campus Santiago and Viña del Mar.

Building on the success of the previous four editions, this fifth Conference, titled "Language and Artificial Intelligence: Linguistic Approaches and Interdisciplinary Challenges," encourages participants to explore the impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI) on language. As Chat GPT indicates:

Artificial intelligence (AI) has transformed the way we interact with language online. It has enhanced the understanding and generation of human language, facilitating automatic translation, autonomous text generation, grammar and style correction. It has also advanced voice recognition, improved online search engines, and enabled the generation of conversational content, as well as the personalization of online content. Despite this progress, challenges arise regarding privacy and linguistic biases that must be addressed responsibly.

In this context, participants are invited to reflect—from different linguistic perspectives and interdisciplinary approaches—on the scope, contributions, limitations, risks, and challenges posed by this new tool in various human domains, such as language, academia, sciences, philosophy, etc. Additionally, discussions are expected regarding topics on the multiple applications of AI.

The opening of this fifth version of the Congress will be held by **Carolina Gainza**, Subsecretary of the Ministry of Science, Technology, Knowledge and Innovation of Chile, as well as the participation of the guest panelists **Lionel Brossi**, Director of the Núcleo Inteligencia Artificial y Sociedad IA+SIC dela Universidad de Chile and **Tomás Vera**, foundation member of LIANM (Laboratorio de Inteligencia Artificial y Neurociencia y Metaverso) del Congreso Futuro.



Those interested in participating with a paper or thematic panel should submit an abstract, according to the type of proposal, by **April 10, 2024**, via email to: prisma@uai.cl, adding as message title "PRISMA Conference 2024."

Abstracts, written in Spanish or English, in Word format, should include the name of the presenter(s), their institutional affiliation, the title of the presentation, the body of the text, five keywords, the thematic axis, and the participation modality (in-person or hybrid). Papers should contain between 200 and 300 words. Thematic panel proposals, led by groups of researchers, should include a summary, between 500 and 1000 words, in addition to properly identified abstracts for each presenter.
